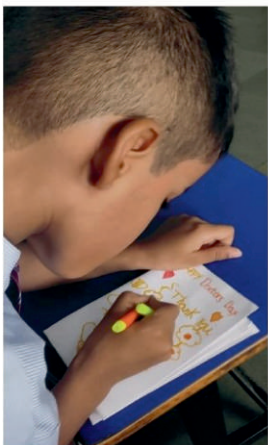
Class I&II – Handmade Greeting Cards

The session allowed them to understand healthy boundaries and consent.

Educational Field Trip to Zoological Survey of India
